How to Form a War Savings Society

A War Savings Society is a group of patriotic citizens who are using "team work" to secure systematic saving. It seeks to create community sentiment for saving, to cultivate personal habits of thrift, to decrease waste and to enable one and all to help Canada through the dangers and difficulties of the reconstruction period.

Ten or more persons are sufficient to form a War Savings Society. Each member signs an application for membership and agrees to systematically save during the year, indicating how many War Savings Stamps he will endeavor to purchase monthly, or how many Thrift Stamps he will buy each week.

As soon as ten or more application cards have been thus signed, a meeting of the group is held and officers elected. These should be President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.

The President and Secretary, acting for and on behalf of the membership will then apply to the Chairman of the War Savings Committee of the province or provincial district for a Charter. This will in due course issue from Ottawa.

Get together, women and men, girls and boys, of Fort William, organize a society of your own now. Full information, stamps, etc., may be secured from Chas. Birkett, Grain Exchange Building, Secretary of the local committee.
