

CULLEN—TILLEY

On Wednesday, April 16, at seven-thirty in the evening, the marriage of Miss Mabel Tilley, daughter of Mrs. W. H. Tilley, Sault Ste. Marie, to Mr. F. H. Cullen, took place at the home of Mr. and Mrs. John Thoms, 322 Cameron street, Fort William. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Jull. The bride wore a gown of pussy-willow silk with panels and sleeves of white georgette, trimmed with fringe and tassels of silver, the sash of the gown fastened with the bridegroom's badge pin of the 19th battalion. With this costume she wore a hat of black tulle, with velvet streamers, and trimmed with clusters of grapes. Her bouquet was composed of roses and carnations. The bridesmaid was Miss Ada Coleman, who wore a dress of blue satin and georgette and hat of cream lace. She carried a bouquet of sweet peas.

The bridegroom, a war veteran of four years' service, was supported by Mr. Bert Parker, a veteran comrade.

The house was decorated with carnations and ferns and the table, at which the wedding repast was served, was crossed with streamers of satin ribbon, and canopied with ribbons carried to the corners of the table from the wedding bell above.
