

TO EXTEND SALE OF THRIFT STAMPS

PERMANENT ORGANIZATION IS FORMED TO PROMOTE IDEA IN PORT ARTHUR

With the object of extending the sale of saving and thrift stamps in Port Arthur, a permanent organization has been formed. Initial steps to this end were taken a couple of weeks ago, and completed yesterday at the Prince Arthur.

Lieut.-Col. Francis presided at the meeting and a general discussion was held, in which the ground and plan of campaign was gone over.

It is proposed to enlist the help of the citizens generally in the effort to increase the sale of stamps in the city, by a house to house canvas, the enlistment of the help of the ministers and church organizations, and of the trades unions and fraternal societies, formation of savings societies in all lines of industry, by publicity and one tag day.

Following this initial campaign it is hoped that sufficient interest will have been enlisted to hold the sale of stamps at a good figure.
