LIEUT. RAY PENNIMAN, M. C.

Lieut. Penniman, an old collegiate institute boy, enlisted with the 52nd battalion and went overseas with the first draft early in 1915.

When he arrived overseas he joined the Royal Canadians and served with that unit with distinction in the fierce fighting in which it took part in the Ypres salient.

In June of 1916 his unit was at death grips with the enemy, and Lieut. Penniman took command of his company after it had suffered heavy losses in conflict with the Germans, and was without relief for six days. For this gallant and efficient act he was awarded the military cross.

Later in the same year, during the operations on the Somme, Lieut. Penniman was reported missing, and since that time no definite word of his fate has reached his parents, Mr. and Mrs. E. G. Penniman, of this city.

Lieut. Penniman was twenty-six years of age at the time he was reported missing.
