Pte. W. G. Bailey is one of the "originals" who left here in August of 1914 and he has the splendid record of having served all the way through the war, and he accompanied the army of occupation to Germany, where he was in the officers' mess at Canadian headquarters. He was gassed in the famous second battle of Ypres in April of 1915, when the 8th battalion won undying fame in the defence of Ypres against a great German drive.

In another action Pte. Bailey was wounded.
