LIEUT. E. R. WILSON, R. A. F., M. M.

Lieut. Wilson is another well known local boy who has won distinction overseas.

He is a son of Rev. T. B. Wilson and Mrs. Wilson, of Carman, Manitoba. Rev. Mr. Wilson was formerly pastor of Wesley Methodist church, and E. R. Wilson attended the local collegiate institute, remaining here after his graduation, and was employed in George Eoll's real estate office and the insurance department of the firm of Ray, Street and company.

Mr. Wilson was in Winnipeg in the autumn of 1915 and in October enlisted with the 44th battalion as a private.

He became a scout in France, and it was at the battle of Lens

in August of 1917 that he was awarded the military medal for gallant services. In addition, he was recommended for a commission, and was sent to England. There he decided to join the R. A. F.

He went back to France as an aviator and continued in that service until the end of the war.

Lieut. Wilson, who is still in England, has escaped unwounded from all the engagements in which he has been.

Lieut. Wilson is a brother of Mrs. A. M. Frank of Port Arthur.
