

Among the local soldiers who returned from overseas yesterday there was Stanley Smith, one of Fort William's young men who has made a unique record for himself during the great war. Stanley Smith left Medicine Hat with the fifth battalion when it was organized. When the war broke out in August, 1914, Stanley was living at Medicine Hat, and on the call being made for volunteers he enlisted with the fifth battalion, leaving with them, going to Valcartier camp, and crossed with the first contingent. He has been in the service continuously, never having been wounded or being sick for more than a short time, and was with his battalion at the finish of the big job. His parents are Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Smith, 234 north Brodie street, and before going to Medicine Hat he was employed as a printer on the Morning Herald, published in Fort William.
