

War Stamp Campaign Well Under Way

The meeting of representatives of women's organizations of Fort William, called by Mrs. T. M. Piper, to arrange for the war stamp campaign on Thursday and Friday, was held yesterday afternoon in the public library. Miss Mary Black, chairman of the Fort William committee, was present to answer questions and to assist in organizing the campaign committee. Miss Black had availed herself of the authority vested in her as chairman and attended the meeting of the Rotary club, held last Thursday at the Kaministiquia club, the "St. Senanus Isle," where man is supposed to be safe from the intrusion of feminine visitors. She was received with the courteous cordiality she expected and won the promise of assistance from that great helping hand—the Rotary club. The "Life Underwriters' " association also form a powerful ally and these, with the women's organizations, will conduct the canvass and educational work. Mrs. B. O. Allen is general in chief of the rural districts, and has her forces organized and all the women's institutes and schools working for the thrift and war stamp buying.
