

Home from overseas, Col. S. C. Young is preparing to put off his uniform and return to civil life. He arrived in the city a couple of days ago, accompanied by his daughter, Doris Young, clad in the neat uniform of the V. A. D. Since returning to France, from his last leave to Canada, Col. Young has been at work in Boulogne without intermission and left that town direct for Canada, and would have been over here earlier, but for some delays that occurred in transportation over the Atlantic. Speaking of the work of demobilization, Col. Young said that he believed that all that could possibly be done under the conditions of ocean transport was being accomplished and that there was no laxity in the head offices, such delays as have occurred being from causes quite beyond their control. Col. Young is looking extremely well and is in no way averse to resuming the position of a civilian, not under military rule.
