

FORT WILLIAM LEADS CANADA IN SALE OF WAR SAVING STAMPS

Proud Record of \$1.10 Per Capita Reached—Two Cities Buy \$33,122 Worth.

Fort William and Port Arthur and the remainder of Thunder Bay division keep in the lead in the sale of W. S. S. and thrift stamps for all Canada. Fort William leads Port Arthur both in the volume of stamps sold and the per capita rate. Port Arthur sales up to May 16 totalled \$11,551, and Fort William \$21,571, making a total for the two cities of \$33,122. Port Arthur rate per capita is .77c., and Fort William \$1.10. The executive committee in charge of the sale of stamps feels that the war savings societies established here are responsible for the splendid increase in sales and would like to see one in every business place in the city.
